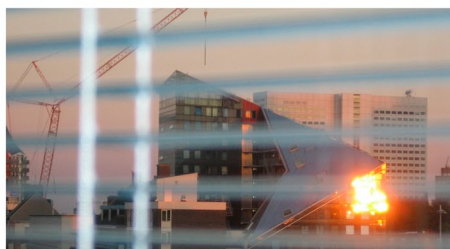

Buildings are at their most vulnerable to major fires during construction or major alteration or extension. Even quite minor fires in a structure under construction can result in major damage and costly delays. Fire prevention on construction sites is essential and proactively managing fire safety is often overlooked compared to traditional construction site health and safety. Modern materials and building methods often increase the consequences of fires due to the materials. Construction workers unfamiliar with the characteristics of non-traditional materials raises the risk of fire.
