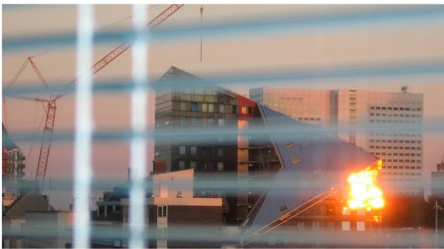

Description
