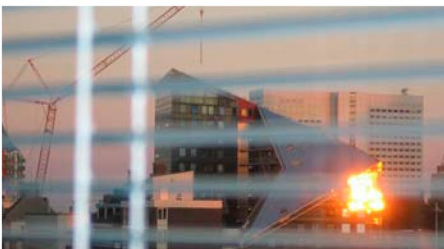

### Description

Many large organisations have been the subject of legal action by fire and rescue authorities enforcing fire safety law. UK fire law requires the employer or other responsible person to actively manage fire prevention and protection. Managing fire safety in organisations requires more than the production of an up to date fire risk assessment. Enforcing authorities are actively auditing organisations' fire safety management systems as well as auditing the fire risk assessment and inspecting premises. The event will describe the duties placed on the employer or other responsible person and how to demonstrate due diligence in selecting

competent person and organising and managing them. The event will provide a framework for organising and managing that will meet the requirements of the enforcing authorities.
