Description

The CDM Regulations (2007) provide a 'Goal Setting' framework for the management of health and safety during construction projects. This framework covers the entire project's life-cycle, from inception, through to design, construction, use, maintenance and eventual demolition. As such, it is a substantial piece of legislation which places legal obligations on clients, designers, contractors and other consultants involved in construction. HSE investigations now involve a trace back through the project audit trail to identify the original CDM duty-holders and assess their role including any breaches. Obviously, ignorance of CDM obligations is not a suitable defence. This event will outline the key requirements under CDM and the specific duties and the documents required. It will

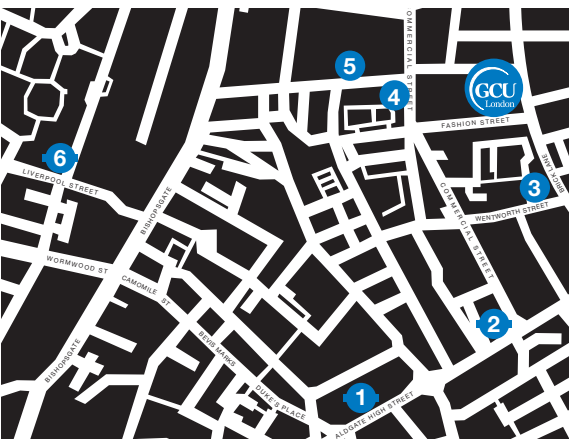
